Highlights

- Saskatchewan leads Canada with respect to Indigenous engagement in the forestry sector
- Dozens of Indigenous owned forestry businesses, ranging from saw mills to timber harvesting, road construction, trucking & reforestation
- 2 of 5 major saw mills are 100% owned & operated by Indigenous businesses, including the largest 100% owned First Nations saw mill in Canada (NorSask Forest Products in Meadow Lake)
- Approximately 1,300 Indigenous people are employed in Saskatchewan's forestry sector, comprising 31% of the total forestry sector workforce, as compared to 4% across Canada ¹
- Saskatchewan represents nearly 10% of Canada's total forestry sector Indigenous employment ¹
- 28% of Saskatchewan's timber supply is allocated to Indigenous businesses, by far the largest percentage of any province ²
